

Tena koutou e hoa ma – Greetings everyone

Last week we sent home the camp forms for you to go over, sign and return. Thank you to everyone who has been able to get those back to us so quickly. We need the forms back as soon as possible so if you haven't been able to get on to it yet please make it a priority – thank you.

I've had lots of people letting me know they are available to help out on camp – actually, lots and lots, which is fantastic but it does mean we will have to limit the numbers. Others of you however, might want to come out to the island for day trips, and join in with us on the Wednesday or Thursday. You are most welcome to do that, so come along if you can arrange it – it will be great to see you there.

Our departure time from the wharf is very early on the Wednesday morning and it will take some organising to get all of the children here on time because it will be too early for the school bus. We will make sure everyone can get a ride in to Paihia and we can use the school van to collect individuals if that is needed.

Jim Whitehorn from Explore NZ has asked that we all be on board the boat so that it can leave at 7:20am. That means we need to be on the Paihia wharf no later than 6:50am because it will take about half an hour to load everybody on.

The children have taken home gear lists – we want them to be able to have all of their gear in one bag / pack so that they can carry it on with them as they board.

We will have a camp meeting on Thursday 11th at 3:00pm for any of you who would like to come along and talk things through. Other than that, I will talk more about these things in the next newsletter.

By the way, one thing not included in the gear list is a sleeping mat or squab that the children may want to include for comfort.

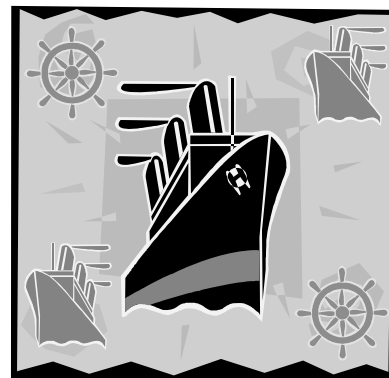
On the positive side, lots of children have already sold their allocation of tickets and are keen to sell more.
